

All of us who knew special touch and her dedication to this beautiful and unique place. 95




























KAY'S BIO

My mother, Catherine "Kay" Cataldo, was born in Cincinnati, Ohio on July 24, 1924, the only child of John and Mabel Drieborg of Grand Rapids, Michigan. During her childhood, the family moved around the Midwest as my grandfather was a general manager for Swift and Co. During those years, she attended Catholic schools and later went to a Jesuit college, the University of Detroit, for five years. After college she worked for a family doctor as a medical receptionist.

My grandfather passed away when my Mom was in her mid-20s, and she continued to live with my grandmother until her death about ten years later. Mom then sold the home that she had lived in with her mother

and moved to an apartment in Detroit. While at the apartment's pool, she met an eligible bachelor named Jim Cataldo. They married in 1965 and moved to Pompano Beach, Florida.

It was in Florida where my Dad learned about Sant Kirpal Singh Ji Maharaj and immediately was under the spell of the Masters. Mom, being a dutiful wife and with a baby on the way, went along with the vegetarianism and initiation. On October 19,1968, less than two weeks after I was born, she received holy initiation.

In 1976, the Center in Bowling Green, known then as the Unity of Man Center, needed a manager/ director. Jamie and Martha Smith were managing the Center at that time, but they were planning to move to India. Jim Cataldo's name was mentioned, and he jumped at the offer. The Cataldo family moved to Bowling Green in November 1976.

The transition from Florida to rural Bowling Green was difficult for my Mom but she persevered. While my Dad was busy with building plans and construction for the Center, overseeing Sawan Kirpal Publications, and sending out the Sat Sandesh, Mom remained in the background doing her quiet seva – maintaining the guesthouse and keeping up the grounds.

My Dad's time as director came to an end when he left the body December 1, 1982. Shortly thereafter, Master Darshan appointed Mom as director of the Center as well as a group leader, and gave her the authorization to read instructions for initiation. At first, she was overwhelmed and not really comfortable with these duties, but accepted them as a great gift and performed them with 100% dedication.

As the years passed, her love for the Masters and the

Mission grew and grew. She was steadfast in her responsibilities with the daily operations and maintenance of the buildings and grounds, sending out the Sat Sandesh until it was moved to Chicago, and preparing for tour stops, summer camps, retreats and special functions. Her most recent excitement regarding the Center was the new site plan. Plans are going forth for a new meditation building, repur-

posing some of the existing buildings, and reorganizing the layout of the grounds.

Aside from being a dedicated sevadar my Mom was an extremely devoted mother and grandmother. She cherished spending time with her family, and took many trips with them. She also loved going on tour stops with the Master and to Chicago where she could spend time with

her satsangi family. She thoroughly enjoyed the hustle and bustle at the Center during the Master's visits and summer camp, but also relished the peace and serenity when everyone was gone.

Throughout her life, Mom always had a purpose and a focus. This is what kept her active and vibrant to the end. Above all, she was so very grateful – grateful for the Master's protection and love, grateful for the work, grateful for her family, and grateful for her wonderful friends. My family, Novey, Kaylin, Nigel and I, will always be grateful for the heartfelt tributes to my Mom.  $\odot$
